Significant Accomplishments

The Trojan Volleyball team earned their second state championship in six years after defeating North Branch in an epic 5 set comeback. They also continued their winning ways, taking home Conference and GMAA championships prior to the tournament run.

Fruitport was runner up to Spring Lake in the Lakes 8 All Sports Award.

The Boys Basketball team was a recipient of the "Top 100" Sportsmanship Award, sponsored by the National Guard and the MHSAA.

Volleyball Coach Nicole Bayle was Class B Coach of the Year.

The Competitive Cheer Team placed third in the GMAA championships.

The girls' basketball team had one of its best seasons in school history, finishing third in the Lakes 8 with an overall record of 12-9. They defeated rival Spring Lake (twice) for the first time in 10 years. They were also recognized for ranking 10th in the state in team GPA.

Beka German achieved a rare accomplishment of making All Conference first or second team in three sports, and was a finalist in the Muskegon Chronicle's student athlete of the year award.

Josh Shreve qualified for Boys State Bowling Finals, finishing 17th overall.

Caitlin Alviar had the League's best individual series (392) in Girls Bowling.

10 wrestlers finished with 20 or more wins. Brandon Brown qualified for the State Tournament.

Girls tennis player Elnes Ohnewald was a regional runner up and qualifier for state finals.

The Varsity Baseball team finished with their best record in years, twice beating top 10 teams during the season.

Toni Parker (high jump) and Brianna Pekel (400 M run) were regional track champions.

The girls golf team finished third in the conference, their best showing since starting in the league.

Each FHS staff coach had the opportunity to receive certification in CPR/AED sponsored by Mercy Health Partners.

Several teams participated in voluntary service projects this past year. The Boys and Girls Basketball and Boys Soccer teams joined forces with No More Sidelines and ran activities and clinics for special needs athletes. The football team continued their elementary reading program, the construction of wheelchair ramps, and assisting the Lions Club with Old Fashioned Days activities. They also hosted The Lakes 8 Conference first Cancer Awareness game, raising funds for both local and national cancer causes, and were a feature story on Fox 17's Pay It Forward program.
